# A MESSAGE FROM THE CITY

Friends and neighbors:

This fall and into next year, the City is embarking on several strategic initiatives surrounding infrastructure and land use planning with an eye toward the very vibrant present and bright future of our great community. We are excited to share with you the exciting work being done by our appointed and elected officials and our City staff.

# <u>Urban Land Institute Technical Assistance</u> <u>Panel</u>

In October, ULI will conduct a TAP to collect community input and to provide professional guidance and recommendations for evaluating the future of the southwest corners of both 47th St. & Rainbow Blvd. and 50th St. & Rainbow Blvd. This panel of experts will produce a report with recommendations on how these corners could best be used to provide civic spaces and facilities (including parks), additional retail and restaurants, and additional housing options. This 2021 TAP will build upon the 2015 TAP conducted by ULI, which is available on the City's website. The public presentation of the TAP's work will be held in a hybrid format the evening of Thursday, October 21st and all in the community are welcome and encouraged to attend.

# City Facilities Assessment

The adopted 2022 budget includes a facilities assessment to study the existing condition of City Hall and the Public Works building and to identify any deferred maintenance issues that might be present and/or retrofits needed to operate at a level of service adequate for current and future City use or if new facilities should be planned based on the findings of the ULI TAP.

## Zoning Regulations Review

Over the course of the past year, the Planning Commission has been reviewing the City's zoning ordinance and is recommending several changes, especially to the provisions in the single-family zoning district. The Planning Commission is set to wrap-up its work on these recommendations and to hold public hearings on the text amendments this fall. Planning Commission agendas, meeting packets, and minutes are all

available on the City's website should you wish to review the discussions and to see how the recommendations have been discussed to-date.

# **Bike and Pedestrian Improvements**

Following passage of the City's Complete Streets Policy and Plan this past year, several bike/ped improvement projects and planning are underway. In 2022, 47th St. will undergo reconstruction to add bike lanes and off-street pathways and to add pedestrian-level street lights and new land-scaping and bike-related equipment. Also in 2022, pedestrian safety improvements will be made to 50th St. & Belinder Ave. to support the new home of Westwood View in anticipation of its 2022/2023 opening to students, and the City will begin the process of working with our neighboring jurisdictions to evaluate whether bike and pedestrian improvements should be added to Rainbow Blvd. and Mission Rd.

# **Pavement Condition Study**

The City Council budgeted for a city-wide pavement condition study to be conducted in 2022, to report on the structural condition of all our streets and to provide a recommended prioritization for capital planning and budgeting.

# City Website Redesign

The City has planned and budgeted for a 2022 website redesign to modernize the website and to make it more accessible and user-friendly. We will need lots of great photos of the community and the people and places within it for the new site and welcome photo donations from individuals willing to have their photography and images on the new website. ## 2021 LEAF PICK UP GUIDELINES

Fall is here and with it brings the Westwood leaf pick up program, those who wish to participate please take note:

Leaf pickup began on Monday, November 1st.

Westwood Public Works will be conducting leaf pick up operations in Westwood the entire month of November through early to mid-December of 2021. Public Works



personnel will be making passes through the City starting at 51st Terrace and will work their way north to 47th Street. Once they have passed your residence, City staff may not be back for a week or more de-

pending on the volume of leaves to be gathered, the weather, and/or mechanical difficulties with the equipment.

To ensure the collection of your leaves, please remember the following:

- No sticks or trash only leaves. Piles containing an abundance of sticks will be left until the sticks are removed
- Please rake leaves into as narrow a pile as possible
- Please avoid raking the leaf piles directly under low-hanging tree branches as the leaf collection equipment gets tangled in the low overhanging limbs. A minimum of 14 feet in height, from the ground to the lowest limb is needed to operate the equipment. If this condition is found to exist, your leaves will be left until the pile is moved to a location that is accessible
- Rake just to the curb or edge of the sidewalk but not into the streets, gutters, or onto the sidewalk so as to not force pedestrians into the street

After the final pass through the city, Westwood staff will sweep the streets and gutter lines a final time. Residents may still use GFL's yard waste program by bagging leaves in paper bags or rigid containers designated for yard waste. Yard waste collection runs year round and there is no limit on the amount of yard waste that can be collected on a Wednesday per residence per week by GFL.

In addition to painting, Dennis has been a wood carver for over 45 years, and has learned from some of the best carvers in the country.

Dennis is a member of the Images Gallery in Overland Park and the Senior Arts Council, and he was published in the October 2018 "Johnson County Lifestyle" magazine.

Dennis has been married to Jo, the love of his life, for almost 50 years. It has been through her encouragement that he continues to learn and grow as an artist. Dennis and Jo have two sons, Bronson and Brad, and their family has expanded to now include two daughters-in-law and six grandchildren. Dennis and Jo have lived in Stilwell for 37 years.
