### **ABOUT ENTERCOM COMMUNICATIONS**

Entercom is a broadcasting company that owns more than 100 radio stations in 23 markets. They currently own the property at 50<sup>th</sup> & Belinder where two towers sit on nearly 8 acres of land in the heart of Westwood. The property has been used for radio transmissions since before Westwood was incorporated as a municipality. While the radio station remains grandfathered, years ago the property was zoned for Residential use by the City. Any other use requires a zoning change.

Interested suitors of the property began looking into the possibility of purchasing the property within the last two and half years. The City was aware of at least six interested prospective buyers. However since this is private property, the City did not engage in negotiations or arrange any plans. Discussions included ideas for residential housing, new commercial office space, expanded parking for KU and conversations with the Shawnee Mission School District and Johnson County Library.

Entercom does have an offer from a private developer to buy the property. I, along with members of the Planning Commission, Council and staff attended a meeting last August at CBC Real Estate Group, who informed us of having a letter of intention to buy the property. They first visited City leadership in 2012 and at that time expressed interest in developing a Senior Living facility that would include *Independent & Assisted Living*. However, since the current ordinances do not permit this anywhere in Westwood, the City cannot even entertain such a proposal and the developer cannot submit a proposal unless an amendment to the current ordinances is considered. This amendment would not be specifically regarding Entercom but the current contract on the property represents the catalyst.

As a point of clarity, no rezoning proposal has been submitted at this time. Discussions at the Council and Planning Commission began at the end of 2014. On Monday January 19th, your City Council and Planning Commission held a joint work session to discuss this very topic. It was determined that the current Westwood zoning ordinances do not contemplate for a development of independent and assisted living anywhere in Westwood.

And it was unanimous that the City would like to be able to see what a proposal would look like.

Simply put, the City cannot decline a proposal that does not exist or decline a plan prior to its submission. The consensus among the Council and the Planning Commission was to draft a text amendment contemplating such a planned zoning district. When this is complete, the developer will still need to submit application for a preliminary plan review and rezoning of the property. This would then come before the full Planning Commission and in the public forum.

The text amendment that is being considered in no way grants the developer approval of a zoning change, nor does it grant approval of a preliminary plan; merely the ability for them to submit an application and show their plan. I realize that Entercom will be a sensitive issue for many, so there will be ample opportunity throughout this process for comment and input. This represents a dramatic change in Westwood including the removal of the two towers, the likes which have not been a possibility in the past.

I understand there will be concerns as many on the Council also have concerns about usage and density on this particular site in our City. We will be objective in our vetting and purposefully look for what will be the best opportunity for the City's future, keeping in mind that this is private property and not City-owned. I encourage you to be a part of all public meetings and invite you to voice your thoughts as this unfolds. ## YARD WASTE PICK-UP RESUMES ON MARCH 11TH

Town & Country will resume yard waste pick-up on March 11th and will continue collection every Wednesday through the end of the year.

When you are placing yard waste out for collection, make sure you are following the guidelines below to ensure it is collected:

- Place yard waste in paper bags or rigid containers designated for yard waste
- Bundled yard waste should be tied up with biodegradable twine and it should not exceed 4 feet in length or 18 inches in diameter
- No bag or bundle shall exceed 60 pounds
- Do not place yard waste materials in plastic garbage bags

## **SNOW REMOVAL INFORMATION REMINDER**

When snow starts falling in Westwood, it is important to keep the following information in mind.

## OFF STREET PARKING ORDINANCE

A Message from Chief O'Halloran

Most Westwood streets are very narrow and cars parked along the city streets make snowplowing difficult and even hazardous at times. Westwood has an overnight parking ordinance, which prohibits parking for more than 2 hours between midnight and 6:00 a.m. It is designed to help alleviate some of those problems and it also aids in the response by all emergency vehicles to residents in need, all year-round. Therefore, this ordinance will be strictly enforced at all times. All vehicles in violation will be ticketed.

When snow accumulation of two or more inches is expected, persons with parking permits are asked to try to park their vehicles in their driveways or in the parking lots of nearby businesses in order to keep the streets as empty as possible. This will expedite the professional snow removal services provided by our Public Works employees that we have come to expect and that snow removal is a vital part of our public safety strategy to respond to calls for service. So, please assist us in the making this a safe and effective process for all.

### SNOW REMOVAL STANDARDS

A message from John Sullivan, Public Works Director Only a salt mixture is applied to the primary routes and hills, curves, and approximately 60 feet from intersections with light accumulation of snow.

With an accumulation of about 2 inches of snow, Westwood Public Works staff begins plowing, concentrating on the primary routes until the snow fall has stopped or the accumulation reaches about 6 inches.

If snow has reached 6 inches and is still falling, staff will plow two passes down each secondary route. Once the snow has ended, the primary routes are plowed once more and then plow the secondary routes full width. At that time Westwood Public Works staff will treat the streets with de-icing or traction materials as needed.

# Primary routes are:

- Belinder Road
- Mission Road
- Rainbow Boulevard
- State Line Road
- 47th Place
- 47th Street
- 50th Street
- 51st Terrace

All other streets are defined as secondary routes.

## **NEW ONLINE REGISTRATION PROCESS AVAILABLE**

Westwood Staff has added a POD/Dumpster Application to the Forms section of the City's website. A POD/Dumpster permit is required for the placement of a POD or dumpster on your property or in your driveway for an extended period of time that is not associated with a construction project that has been issued a valid building permit. In addition to the POD/Dumpster online registration, other online City registrations include Garage/Estate Sales and Public Safety's House Watch form.
